



PRM Training | Emergency Planning Committee (EPC) Training for Healthcare & Aged Care

The focus of this training relates to the development and management of the workplace emergency management plan (EMP), by a learned group within the organisation, the Emergency Planning Committee (EPC). Contemporary EPC's have a valuable function overseeing all functions relating to the prevention, preparation, and response for emergencies, and similarly are a valuable resource in the fact-finding mission post emergency stage of recovery.

As a function of this training and PRM's commitment to our clients, PRM staff remain a continuing resource to the EPC post training to maintain the momentum of the group.

The EPC will be trained and operates within the boundaries of AS 4083, Planning for Emergencies Health care facilities, NSW Health Policy Directive 2010_24, AS 3745 relevant workplace health and safety regulations and industry best practice.

- Post emergency reporting by the EPC in an initial and substantial capacity
- Connecting with the work group, making the EPC visible
- Pre and Post Emergency activities
- Assisting occupants with disabilities and visitors in the workplace (including Personal Emergency Evacuation Plans)
- Conducting a foundation EPC meeting
