



PRM Training | Resident Fire Safety Awareness Aged Care Seminars

The training will focus on fire safety and prevention initiatives for aged residents living independently, or in supported living accommodation.

The first attack fire training component of this training will factor in the abilities of the residents, and the safest options available to them should they experience a fire in the home. The seminar will maintain a safety-first, risk adverse perspective at all times.

This seminar is based upon the requirements of the Retirement Villages Amendment Act 2020, AS 3745 2010 and the Workplace Health & Safety Act & Regulations 2011.

Topics Discussed

- Specific emergency incidents that may impact upon the residence
- Pre-emergency activities including fire prevention.
- Engaging with emergency services
- Different alarms and tones available at the facility
- Smoke detection and alarms for the hearing impaired
- Human behaviour during emergencies
- Assisting occupants with disabilities, and low mobility
- Building performance during emergencies
- Selection & Use of First Attack Equipment including practical use of extinguishers and fire blankets
